



Community Projects

Partnering with communities for more resilient landscapes

We engaged residents in communities that have experienced environmental injustice to work with us on creating more resilient outdoor spaces. In one program, we worked with six affordable housing communities to incorporate clean water practices and native planting for pollinators, and that centered community priorities. Residents were active decision-makers in their project. We hired residents as project stewards and to work alongside us in planting and landcare.

These projects are made possible by public and private funding — including watershed districts, cities, and counties, foundations, property owners and individual donations — and by partnering with deeply rooted community members and organizations.


Blooming Boulevards in Minneapolis

This program transformed residents' boulevards in several North Minneapolis neighborhoods into beautiful raingardens featuring native pollinator-friendly plants. Community partners helped us recruit participants to receive a blooming boulevard. Metro Blooms Design+Build helped residents with design and plant choices. Residents learned about stormwater capture and benefits of native plants.

Learning With Blue Thumb



Blue Thumb - Planting for Clean Water is Metro Blooms' education program and a partnership of local governments, landscape contractors, native plant nurseries and others committed to promoting native plantings, raingardens and shoreline plantings.

Sustainable Landcare Training

We're growing a local workforce and creating job and education pathways in the environmental field. This 30-hour program covers stormwater basics, installing and caring for green infrastructure, native plants and more. We had 73 participants in 2022.

Many youth members of All Nations Church took part in landcare training in North Minneapolis. Afterwards, several participants became a paid crew for Metro Blooms, planting and maintaining area boulevard projects.

DIY Workshops



We reached hundreds of DIYers with our Resilient Yards and Pollinator
Lawns workshops. We also debuted a partnership with MN SEED for workshops on collecting native seed and winter sowing.

Minnesotans received individual grants of up to \$350 to plant native pollinator habitat at home. Blue Thumb managed the program for the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources.


Neighborhood of Raingardens


Neighborhood of Raingardens makes it easier for residents in participating neighborhoods and cities to add a raingarden in their yard. Conservation Corps MN & Iowa, one of our partners, provides crews paid by the Clean Water Fund, helping to lower residents' costs and reduce practical challenges like excavating soil.

Protecting Shorelines

With help from Conservations Corps MN & Iowa, we planted 454 native plants in shoreline buffers at three residential properties on Lake Minnewashta. The project was financially supported by residents, the Carver Soil & Water Conservation District and Lake Minnewashta Preservation Association.










Neighborhood of Gallons stormwater


