Designing Your Own Pollinator Meadow

The meadow is planted in a "matrix" style, with flowering plants mixed in with grasses and sedges. The grasses help cover the ground, blocking out weeds and acting as a living mulch.

Keep it simple! Choose just a few flowering species to repeat across your "meadow." Try to have something blooming in every season!

Adding a sign helps let your neighbors know how your yard is doing good! It's a great conversation starter for sharing how native plants support pollinators and protect clean water.
