## **Working Towards Environmental Justice**

# **Everybody** has a right to clean air, land and water

We work towards climate-resilient green spaces that soak in and clean rain water, offer cooling shade and provide habitat. Our work centers communities most impacted by environmental injustices, including Black, Indigenous and people of color, and low-income and rental communities. We listen carefully to community concerns and respond to their vision, encouraging community members to be part of decision-making through an equitable engagement process.

- 1,424 people participated in programs centering communities impacted by environmental injustices.
- 38 programs and engagements led by Metro Bloom young adult Community Relations staff
- **8,745** native plants planted in **46** rain or pollinator gardens
- 55 trees planted

#### Some highlights

At Penn Place, a rental community in Bloomington, we replaced a canopy of unhealthy ash trees with a diversity of native species.

Community members of all ages joined us to plant 14 trees.

A redesign at Highland Gables, a rental community in Brooklyn Park, included several rain and pollinator gardens — and a patio, picnic table and grills. We held two planting events with many community members. Some later attended our landcare training to continue learning and working alongside us!





We winter-sowed native plants in milk jugs with **Green Garden Bakery**, a youth-run business in Minneapolis. We used plants from our winter-sowing in their new rain garden — which we planted together!

## **Working Towards Environmental Justice**

#### **Partnering with community**

We nurture longstanding relationships within communities, allowing us to learn from local knowledge and do better work together. These partnerships typically continue over several years. The work should benefit the people who live there the most. We pay people for their time, from planning to planting to maintaining the gardens alongside us.

# Let's meet at the Flowers That Beam Community Garden

Last summer, our young adult community relations team led plantand pollinator-focused activities with kids at Beam Apartments in North Minneapolis. We had the perfect location: the Flowers That Beam Community Garden. We codesigned and planted the mini-park with the Beam community in 2023.



"My job was to listen to the community and put their ideas to paper. They wanted a clean, safe place to relax in the shade, and lots of colorful flowers. We added pedestrian lights, trash cans, benches, a short fence along Cedar Avenue and lots of trees. #### **Riverside Plaza**

Our partnership with the community at <u>Riverside Plaza</u>, a rental complex in the heart of Minneapolis, started in 2018 with a parking lot rain garden. Throughout, the <u>Riverside Plaza Tenants Association</u> has worked to connect us to community members. Most recently, we transformed an underutilized open space into a beautiful mini-park with gardens, benches and walking paths. In 2024, many residents — from young children to elders — helped plant 23 native trees at a <u>tree-planting</u> <u>event</u>. Elders gather in the park with their tea in the early evening.

- We partnered with **8** rental communities.
- We worked with **20** community partners.
- We hired **759** community members to work alongside us.

## **Native Plants + Protecting Pollinators**

### **Creating habitat**

Native plants are more climate resilient, contribute greatly to soil health and provide habitat for pollinators. We support individuals and communities in projects that bring native plants into their green spaces.

#### **Turf to Pollinator Gardens**

We partnered with Wilderness in the City, park and conservation agencies and others to create six pollinator gardens in Twin Cities regional parks, showcasing native plants ands styles of planting to support pollinators. Volunteers including Master Gardeners, corporate groups, local residents and St. Paul grade-schoolers planted the gardens! One partner, **Wakan Tipi Awanyankapi**, selected native plant species with importance to Dakota people for the project at Keller Lake Regional Park.



#### **Lawns to Legumes**

Minnesotans received grants and support to plant native pollinator habitat at their home. Through our Blue Thumb education program, we facilitated Lawns to Legumes with the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources. Some grantees welcomed visitors to their yards for the first annual Lawns to Legumes Garden Tour Day. Our community relations team surveyed more than 450 people at BIPOC community events as part of evaluating the program's accessibility. Thank you, volunteer coaches, for your time helping Lawns to Legumes grantees!

#### **Design+Build**

Metro Blooms Design+Build, a for-profit supporting the Metro Blooms non-profit, designs, installs and maintains projects featuring more sustainable practices. Design+Build works with individual homeowners and commercial, institutional and other clients; maintains green infrastructure practices for large properties; and collaborates closely in our community and education programming.

- **33** projects installed
- More than 130 rain gardens and other stormwater practices maintained

## **Taking Action for Clean Water**

#### **Neighborhood of Rain Gardens**

Neighborhood of Rain Gardens makes it easier for residents in participating neighborhoods and cities to add a rain garden in their yard. The program lowers costs and reduces practical challenges like excavating soil. Conservation Corps MN & Iowa provides crews paid by the Clean Water Fund. Metro Blooms Design+Build manages the program and provides onsite consultations and a rain garden design for each resident. Typically, residents do the actual planting after picking up their plants at a designated pickup spot — this way they get to know their plants!

- 57 new rain gardens installed
- **4836** native plants in gardens
- Estimated 978,665 gallons stormwater runoff captured annually
- One native plant shoreline restoration: estimated **59,437** gallons stormwater runoff captured annually





#### **Blooming Boulevards**

Blooming Boulevards transforms boulevards into native plant rain gardens that soak in and clean stormwater and provide habitat for pollinators. We partnered with North and South Minneapolis communities, focusing on those impacted by environmental injustices. We connected with community members to share how rain gardens help keep water clean and how native plants support pollinators, and to plant their Blooming Boulevard. We partnered with the youth organizations Beloved Community MPLS, All Nations Youth and Community Assistance Program, Helping Hand Companies and Green Garden Bakery to plant and care for gardens.

## **Sustainable Landcare Training**

# Growing a green workforce and environmental stewardship

Participants gain job-ready skills in maintaining and inspecting rain gardens, native plantings and other climate-resilient practices, as well as a greater understanding of our relationship to the environment. We offer the 30-hour training primarily to young adults in communities impacted by environmental injustices. Stipends for participants and learning sites close to public transit help reduce barriers to joining.

"The program opened up my eyes to seeing a lot more things in our environment that we need to change, that we need to make better to grow, and I think that's big." — Jay, SLC '24

- We had **55** trainees in **3** training groups.
- We later hired 7 trainees to work on Metro Blooms Design+Build projects, including prepping and planting large sites in Minneapolis.
- After training, 4 trainees worked inspecting city-installed rain gardens in Minneapolis.



# Highlights kers offered larg

- Some new speakers offered larger context, including Indigenous perspectives of land and water and building financial security.
- Young adult community relations staff led discussions focused on environmental justice.
- We matched <u>trainees with mentors</u> in the environmental field for next-step support.
- We celebrated landcare training at summer's end, inviting partners, supporters, and Blue Thumb partners to learn about the program and meet trainees.

## **Learning + Sharing Resources**

#### **Resilient Yards Workshops**

We provided resources to help people take action at home. Blue Thumb's Online Learning Series lets people learn about Resilient Yards, Turf Alternatives, Resilient Shorelines and Seed Saving, at their own pace. We offer this free. We also continued our live workshops, online and in person. After attending a workshop, 60 percent of attendees who filled out a survey reported taking action in their yard!

#### Workshops for land trust homeowners

We partnered with the **City of Lakes Community Land Trust** to provide sustainable gardening and maintenance workshops to many first-time homeowners. We planted a pollinator garden for a **CLCLT homeowner who hosted workshops**. We also surveyed homeowners on their interests. Tree care, identifying weeds and native plants were popular topics — for future work together.











### **2024 FINANCIALS**
